

Highlights of October Parish Council

The October meeting of Parish Council opened with Eloise Henault sharing the thought that we are all children of God, regardless of age. She read the book entitled "The Quiltmaker's Gift" which carries a message for all ages.

The Topic of the Month included the sharing of ideas about honoring Lucille Frisbee's life and contributions to the United Ministry. This will be given thought and discussed further in the future.

In addition, Pastor Cathy talked about how in the past the United Methodist challenged congregations to look for opportunities of improvement and to pursue them. Now, the approach is to find and recognize what you do well as a church and keep doing it. The group discussed many aspects that we do well, including the food pantry and food giveaways, the musical aspects of our worship and the opening of our church building to outside groups to use. We also feel that our involvement with youth is important and doing well. There is a new play group using McIntosh Hall on Monday mornings, Playschool has 9 students and Kid's Club is up to 12 children (grades k-5) and we have a confirmation class of 1, currently. Gideon shared that there may be an opportunity in the future to have a youth group as the current children in Kids Club age out and are ready to move on.

Playschool did not have anything new to report, but Pastor Cathy did mention that she believes they made around \$500 from the bake sale at the Harvest Festival in September.

The minutes from the September meeting of Parish Council were reviewed and approved.

Laura Clark presented the Treasurer's report as of 9/30/22. Brief discussion was held, and the report was approved.

Jeff Ackerly reported that the Trustees would meet the following day on 10/18/22. There has been a lot of discussion among trustees about developing a maintenance position for the church, including duties and hours. This will be discussed further at the next meeting. There will be no Trustee's workday this fall but a lot has been accomplished. The side of the church has been painted and the parking lot was sealed, and new lines painted on.

Stephanie McCann reported that the Finance Committee met on 10/13/22 and started working on the budget for 2023. John Bramley is giving the church \$10,000 to be used for heating oil. Stephanie and Carol will be setting up a meeting with the New Covenant Foundation to discuss our investment accounts. The plan for the 2023 budget is to hold an informational budget meeting at coffee hour, likely December 12, to present a draft for the congregation well ahead of the annual meeting. The Stewardship letter will go out the week of 10/24 and Stewardship Sunday will be November 13, where pledges will be dedicated.

SPR met on October 4th and continue to discuss the employee evaluation process. Pastor Cathy's last vacation day will be November 27 and she will work on pulpit supply for that day.

Pastor Cathy reported that she did a memorial service for David Dandignac on 10/8 and Lucille Frisbee on 10/15. Total Sunday morning attendance numbers have been averaging around 35. Kids Club has 12 children now and 3rd, 4th and 5th graders will receive Bibles in church on 10/30, which is also when they will sing. We do not know yet when our annual meeting will be but most likely mid-January. The cooperative Parish will be meeting Sunday afternoon, November 6th and Pastor Cathy and others will need to attend. She is looking for a volunteer to serve on a laity Cooperative Parish Committee to represent our church. Cathy reported that she attended a Pastor's School on 10/10-10/11 in Durham, NC as continuing education. She is intending to meet with nominating committee on 10/18 but that may be conflicting now with Trustees.

Cathy Johnson shared that letters for a church directory update have started to be sent out. There will be a potluck lunch after church on 10/30. We are always looking for more people to help host coffee hour, please call Carol or Cathy if interested. Coffee Hour supply donations are also welcome.

Edie did not have anything new to report on the food pantry other than that Thanksgiving boxes will be handed out on 11/21. Carol mentioned that the next food giveaway will be scheduled for November 5th.

Fred would like a list of names and addresses so he can work on outreach postcards. Pastor Cathy will help get this information.

There were no new building use requests forms this month. Pastor Cathy reported the new Play Group is having a great time on Monday mornings and there are 2-3 families coming so far.

It was shared that Deb is working very hard every week to make sure out technology and live streaming is successful each Sunday. Thank you, Deb, for you dedication and effort.

Our meeting was closed in prayer.
