

#### **Ministers Musings**

The sun is out, the flowers are beautiful, the grass is long, and Rick is headed out soon to cut it. Even from behind a lawnmower, it's easy to give thanks to God on a day like this. 'Thanks, God, for the beauty of the peonies and the warmth of the sun.' But Obadiah and I were out walking late, two weeks ago, and it was dark, very dark. There was no moon, nor could we see the stars, and it was cold and damp. I felt alone, except for the company of my dog. On walks like that, I need to be deliberate about remembering the presence and love of God in my life. God's love for me doesn't change in the few hours between the cold night and the warm afternoon. God's love is a constant thing. The challenge for me is holding onto that truth when life isn't sunny and joyful. Sometimes life takes us to the uttermost parts of the sea, far from the security of home, far from the certainty of our chosen routine. You and I both know there are times when we feel far away from God and all that is good. Grief and sorrow, anger and shame can all seem to carry us far away from the joy we thought we knew in the love of Jesus Christ. Life can and does bring us difficulty and struggle, and at times it is our own choices whose consequences have brought us down. We can't always choose to be happy; we can't always choose to feel good. What we can do is make deliberate choices to remember, to hold on to the truth we know, that God's grace does not leave us alone. If music speaks to you, sing a hymn to yourself. Read the Psalms over again – Psalm 23, Psalm 139, Psalm 27. Our feelings are powerful, but they are not the ultimate arbiters of reality. God's love and grace are at the foundation of all that is. Yes, the irises and the lilacs shout their own version of 'Alleluia' to the goodness of God in the world, but I recommend that you store a soft 'alleluia' or two deep in your heart. Let them come out when fear or sadness threaten to overwhelm you. Let them remind you again just how deeply you are loved.

Meetings like these allow us to stay connected to churches across the region, worship and praise God, and plan for new ministries and new opportunities to live out the love of Christ together.

#### **Highlights of May Parish Council**

The May meeting of Parish Council opened with devotions led by Fred Onasch. Fred shared a reading about the Bible verse God so Loved the World.

As the Topic of the Month council members received their copies of the book 'A Generous Life' which will also be given to members of the Finance Committee. Everyone is invited to read the book. It was decided we would try to do a stewardship moment during worship on the last Sunday of every month starting with May. June 25<sup>th</sup> will be Faith Giving Sunday. Council members committed to reading the book by the July meeting with Rose Niles.

Eloise Henault reported that the Play School board would be meeting this Wednesday. School year is coming to an end with plans for an end of the year celebration. The recyclable can collection brought in \$388. Most of the current Play School class will be moving on this year so it will be mostly new families for the fall. They are planning events for Fair on the Square. Discussion was held on the Universal Pre-K and that it has taken some of the children that would have been coming to Playschool.

Fran Ackerly presented the Treasurer's report for April. She reported that we had received the \$3000 check from the O'Connor Foundation grant, and it had been moved to the music fund. She also said the report did not reflect the \$20,000 transfer but it has taken place. Fran was going to double check with Gideon as to which contributions by the congregation should go under pledged or unpledged. Most accounts are where we expect them to be this time of year. Parsonage utilities are currently higher than budgeted and that should be looked at when planning the next budget. Discussion was held about our current telephone bills and it was decided that Fran would review the bills with Deb Kearney and get back to council.

Gideon reported to the Trustees that they had met on May 9<sup>th</sup>. They had a successful Community Service Day with students cleaning tables and windows downstairs, gardens and doing yard work at the parsonage. Hot water boosters are completed and the leak in the Playschool was fixed as was the ceiling. Trustees are getting prices to paint the old section of the church as well as talking to masonry people about the front steps repairs. Gideon is going to try to set up a meeting with Amy Warner, ED of the O'Connor Foundation to talk about

opportunities for capital improvement grants as they relate to the building and its use by the community. Ed Chytalo is doing lawns at church as a donation.

Stephanie McCann reported that Finance met this month. There was a donation of \$100 for Kids Club which will go into the Kids Club account. An anonymous donation of \$3000 for fuel will be included in the new Fuel Oil fund which Fran will create. \$10K donation from November 2022 for fuel oil had \$4K used in 2022, \$6K used this year. Finance discussed the \$3000 grant from O'Connor needing to be used for "program expenses", not salaries. The decision was made by Finance to put that money into the Music Fund. We discussed the use of a credit card vs debit card for the Food Pantry purchases but it was decided to leave it as a credit card. Gideon offered to speak to Amy Warner about grants from O'Connor Foundation for building repairs. Barb Jones offered also to touch base with Amy Engels Braemer about opportunities for another grant for the food bank/food giveaway. Deb will be asked to compile the list of all the groups that use our building. We will observe Faith Giving Sunday on June 25th. The committee was reminded that we would be meeting with Rose Niles from New Covenant Funds for a day-long stewardship planning retreat on Saturday, July 8<sup>th</sup>. It was also decided that the financial reports from investments and banks would be done on the last day of the month, so it's easier to compare from month to month.

Barb Jones reported that SPR was meeting on Tuesday and was working on finalizing policy and the evaluation form process for employees. She will bring examples to the next meeting. The goal is to have these completed by June. They continue to discuss staff recognition in the fall.

Pastor Cathy presented in her report that she had missed church service on May 7<sup>th</sup> due to illness and hasn't been visiting because of that as well but has been keeping up via calls and texts. She has returned to the square on Wednesdays for Pastor with Coffee. Kids Club has been going well and is due to end this Wednesday for the year. She attended a wonderful continuing education event on 4/23 about Biblical power and principalities. Cathy reported she had started confirmation class with one young person attending but a number of factors have delayed the class. Plans for completing it are still up in the air. While discussing our absence of programs for our young adults Pastor Cathy suggested that we could possibility do a combination youth group with local Presbyterian churches but would need someone beside herself to lead it. She also reported that she will be

coordinator for the southern part of Delaware County Cooperative Parish, which includes 9 churches. She will continue to go to monthly meetings and maybe host one here. She will be a sounding board and will meet with other coordinators every few months. We are unique because we have a full-time pastor for one church. Carol pointed out this is important for our congregation to hear as we continue stewardship conversations. In our conference with 413 congregations only 6 churches have voted to disaffiliate and only 8 worship more than 100 on Sunday. Pastor Cathy is looking into getting new signs, mostly needed for UM tabling on the square. The Food Pantry also needs a lighter weight sign to place outside when it is open. There is a possibility of working with Deb Fleming. Cathy also discussed what we want to do for Fair on the Square this year. We decided to have a spot where we set up a corn hole game and give out cookies.

Carol reported for Nurture that Cathy Johnson turned over her paperwork for the directory to Deb. Carol along with Charle Cash will fill in by leading upcoming events including a reception after Baccalaureate and Joel's reception. Everyone is encouraged to sign up to host coffee hour as that time of fellowship is enjoyed by all.

Two building use applications were approved.

Our meeting was closed in prayer.

#### **Women's Open Circle**






