# **Ministers Musings**

I spend Wednesday mornings on the Courthouse Square, smack-dab in the middle of the Farmers' Market. Lots of people walk by, some take notice of my *Pastor with Coffee* sign and smile, some stop for a minute and say hello, a few sit down in the empty chair and talk for a while. I've prayed for grandkids, for upcoming medical appointments, and for individuals figuring out

what comes next in life. I get updated on what's going on in town and often hear historical data on days gone by in Delhi. I'm always happy to talk theology, but it's not what most people want to talk about. Being on the Square is fun, and the welcome and respect I receive from people there reminds me that the presence of the church in general, and of United Ministry in particular, is appreciated in the community. I'm not there just because I like people, though I do like people; I'm there because I want the church to be known as a welcoming community, available to anyone and everyone. United Ministry will have a presence – a table with cookies and brochures and friendly faces to talk to – at Fair on the Square for two of the four Fridays in July. The men's breakfast gathers at the Diner on Wednesday mornings at 10. All of these are opportunities to let the world know that the people of God here at 1 Church St., Delhi, seek to be witnesses of Christ's love for the world. We have a great church – you know that at least as well as I know that. But there are lots of people who don't quite know what the church is all about – it's a cool place, sure. But is it weird? Scary? Boring? Too hard? We're not really any of those things, but the way people will know that is through you, through your loving, laughing, caring presence in the world. And they won't know that's Jesus in you if you're embarrassed to talk about it. You don't need to opine on the specifics of atonement or on eschatology. But a word or two about the peace or joy you felt in worship last Sunday, or an invitation to a friend to join you at the Outdoor service in August could be just what our next new member, whoever he or she is, needs to hear. Don't be shy. You are the witnesses who will make someone feel like this would be a good place to be part of.

# **Highlights of June Parish Council**

The June meeting of Parish Council opened with devotions by Stephanie Trass She shared her memories from her early experiences at United Ministry and the influence her mother had on the importance of her family worshiping together. She feels United Ministry has truly become family.

During Topic of the Month Pastor Cathy and Evelyn Jacksto shared their highlights of the Annual Conference which included Pastor Cathy serving communion and both of them singing in the choir as well as many meaningful discussions.

Eloise Henault shared that Play School board has not had a meeting but there will be a bottle drive on June 22<sup>nd</sup> at Bagels and Cream from 9-1.

The Treasurers Report was presented by Laura Clark who indicated that income should be at 42% for this time of year and was only at 24% and expenses were at 37%. Overall we are doing okay at the moment.

Gideon reported that at their last meeting the Trustees accepted, with regrets the resignation of Ed Chytalo effective 6/1/24. He will no longer be mowing lawn so trustees are pursuing someone to take care of the lawn. A \$25,000 withdrawal from investments was initiated. The bid for garden clean-up for \$1200 was approved. They are getting a bid from Webster for the sealing of the parking lot and repainting of lines. Mac Hall kitchen faucet was repaired by Jeff Ackerly. Several odd jobs continue to need to be completed at parsonage. Money market paperwork is being worked on by Gideon. He has signed and returned paperwork for us to receive the bequest from Ann Smith.

The Finance Committee met and discussed the Financial Secretary position and responsibilities it would include. Stephanie Trass will be trained by Laura to do this job. Information about the status of the applications for grants was presented and an update on the work of the task force was given. Their energy is focused on completing the O'Connor Foundation Grant since it is due in September. Information for this grant can then be used when applying for the Helfgott-Renfroe Foundation and Sacred Sites grants.

Delhi Community Fund has award the Food Pantry a \$2000 grant which will be distributed in October.

Laura Clark agreed to get the financial giving statements ready for the congregation by July 1<sup>st</sup>.

Staff Parish Relations met and reviewed the annual evaluation process. Self evaluation forms will be distributed, completed and meetings scheduled with the Pastor, staff person and liaison. Cathy's evaluation will be completed in conjunction with the Annual Report at the end of the year.

The Committee wants to evaluate the change to a shorter work week with the church secretary and all impacted. Discussion was held about Fran being out for most of June and some of July and the need for others to pitch in to keep the church clean.

Also discussed was some feedback about the length of worship service. It was agreed that the sermon length was not the issue and discussed possible suggestions for shortening service to stay closer to an hour.

Pastor Cathy continues to make pastoral visits (on her bike) and meeting and visiting with people during her time on the square on Wednesdays.

She asked the council to approve the acceptance of Katie Palm as a member of United Ministry on July7th by reaffirmation. The motion was approved!

Baccalaureate Sunday will be June 23<sup>rd</sup> at Abundant Life Church and Pastor Cathy will be preaching. We will also have the Gathering of Presbyterians on June 29<sup>th</sup> at First Pres. She will also be preaching then as well.

Pastor Cathy reported she will be away on vacation August  $5^{th}$  through the  $15^{th}$ .

NOW reports included: Fred Onasch (Witness) reported that Men's group continues to meet at the Diner on Wednesdays.

United Ministry will have a presence on the square on the first Friday of Fair on the Square. Cookies are needed to be handed out to visitors. Anyone willing to bake should have cookies to church on the 5<sup>th</sup>. Barb Jones will provide her corn hole game and candy for the children. Fliers are being developed to had out with

information about Kids Club while on the square. We will also have a spot on the Square on the 19<sup>th</sup>.

Evelyn (Worship) stated that June 16<sup>th</sup> will be Music Sunday and June 23rtd will be Volunteer Sunday. She reported that she continues to provide decorations that coincide with the theme for that Sunday.

Coffee hour has been happening almost every Sunday and is enjoyed by all. The Food Pantry is receiving bags of food from a recent food drive being held at Price Chopper. In addition produce has been picked up in Oneonta from the Regional Food Bank. Twice during the last month Joe & Cheryl Greenfield, Carol Greene and Edie Campbell have made the trip to Oneonta and brought home a generous supply of produce to be shared with others.

Council approved the building use application from the Community Band for use of the church during the Friday nights of Fair on the Square to store instruments and for rehearsal.

Our meeting was closed in prayer.

## **Food Mission**

June was rather a hectic month. The numbers at the pantry were down which may have been due to the heat wave but we had a lot going on.

Regional had a trial program where they would deliver cases of produce to the parking lot in Oneonta. This was available for pantries to pick



Oneonta. This was available for pantries to pick up and wasn't open to the public. Carol went the first time and returned with cases of salad kits and yogurt. Joe, Cheryl and I went the 2nd time and brought back sweet potatoes, onions, broccoli and brussels sprouts. Carol was also there that day and picked up cases for distribution at the senior housing community.

Shopping at Price Chopper I discovered that once again they were selling bags of food to be donated to us. They had just started and were going to do it for 3 weeks. The first week we picked up 5-6 grocery carts of bags. I realized my storeroom wasn't going to hold 3 weeks of donations at that rate. Carol and I put our heads together and decided we would start to put bags in room 5-6 and when she has another senior box distribution at the end of the summer she would use the bags. Pastor Cathy is on stand-by to get some kids together to unpack and sort bags when we need them.

We also had 2 large donations of outdated bakery bread. Some of that along with peanut butter from the Price Chopper bags and other donated items went to the 16 people being housed at the Buena Vista. Fred keeps us supplied with boxes for them and Deb takes care of the deliveries every month.

On Sunday the 23rd we had a volunteer recognition day. Volunteers were called forward to receive a certificate of appreciation, a tote bag and sticker followed by a special coffee hour. It was amazing to see how many people are involved in making our food missions possible and that didn't include those who make donations of food and/or money.




