

Highlights of August Parish Council

The August meeting of Parish Council opened with Pastor Cathy sharing a devotion inspired by gladiolas from Will Frisbee. She read from Isaiah 40, with the message that flowers in all their beauty come and go, but Gods word is forever.

For the Topic of the Month, Carol Greene reviewed the grant application for the O'Connor Foundation. The grant was worked on by Barb Jones, Carol, Deb Kearney and Fran Ackerly. The application is for \$75,000 total, with \$25,000 distributed each of the next three years to help support the expenses in keeping our building accessible and open to the many groups and organizations who use our facilitates. Council approved the grant and it was submitted to the O'Connor Foundation.

Eloise Henault reported that Playschool had a very successful can/ bottle drive. They also enjoyed doing outreach at the Fair on the Square two different Fridays. Currently there are 6 students committed to attend in the fall with more possibilities.

The Treasurers Report as of February 29, 2024 was reviewed and discussed. Laura indicated that income and expenses should be at 58% for this time of year. Income is at 43% and expenses at 51%

At the last Finance Committee meeting we discussed the money market account that is being set up and about finally getting the online New Covenant accounts accessibility fixed. Recent fraudulent activity on the debit card (which was caught by the bank) brought about discussion. The bank suggested a credit card would be more secure. A motion was made and carried to shut down the debit card and open a credit card account with 3 cards for the food pantry account, to be used by Carol Greene, Laura Clark and Edie Campbell.

Gideon reported that the clean up and mulching of the front gardens has been completed. Trustees have solicited quotes for fuel oil for the upcoming winter and we will be using Kiff. The parking lot has been sealed and new lines were painted back on. After many phone calls Gideon was able to get the sign-in and password straighten out and Peg Baldwin (Treasurer of Trustees) is now able to get the monthly balances on the New Convenant account.

Barb Jones submitted her SPR report via email indicating that they had not made progress on staff evaluations due to summer vacations but have a goal of doing so by September. Pastor Cathy will be off on 11/10 and 11/17. Next meeting is scheduled for September 24^{th} .

Pastor Cathy reported that Chelsea Frisbee Johnson preached on 8/11 and it was great! An unfortunate problem with the laptop prevented it from being live streamed and recorded (problem has been fixed) Pastor Cathy visited with Bob Peet many times before he passed away. She did the memorial service for Carolyn Ferguson. Katie Palm joined the church on July 7th. Outdoor worship service on August 4th was moved inside due to weather, and a potluck dinner followed the service. Cathy is seeking feedback about about the outdoor worship idea. Women's Open Circle picnic was held at the parsonage with 15 attending. We were on the Fair two Friday nights in July and had good outreach with cookies and a game for kids. Kid's Club flyers were handed out. Cathy encourages us to spread the word about Kid's Club. The June 23rd Volunteer Recognition Sunday was great. 113 Price Chopper Food donation bags were recently sorted by Pastor Cathy and the Frisbee and Mills families. She reported that Rick is working with the acolytes and has developed a schedule.

NOW reports included:

Fred Onasch (Witness) reported that Coffee with Pastor and Men's breakfast are going well.

Evelyn (Nurture/Worship) shared her worship folder showcase for the past several weeks.

Outreach/Witness reported that the next giveaway will be September 14th.

In other business council approved building use requests for: Helios Care Tree of Lights Ceremony, Girls Scouts Service Unit #350, Community Dish to Pass (Use of building in case of rain and use of tables on the Square)

The meeting was closed in prayer.


Faith Giving



My sister Pattie has been helping me and we are always giving thanks for the elevator!

Regional has a new program called Shop the Lot where on select days pantries can go and pick up produce for their pantry. Carol went the first time, then Joe, Cheryl and I went and Pattie and i went to the 3rd one which did not have much and what they had was at the end of its shelf life. We did manage to get some corn and some salad and will check out the 2 in September.

Once a month we will continue delivering boxes to the Buena Vista. We are planning on the 3rd Thursday as long as that works for Deb and is not a holiday. Carol is busy planning her first giveaway (after the summer break) of senior community boxes. The plan is for kid's club to unpack and arrange 75 of the Price Chopper bags on the 11th, the 13th we will meet to tape the boxes and do any additional set up. On the 14th we will pack and deliver the boxes.

Price Chopper will be selling bags of select food items for 3 weeks in September. They have agreed to only put together a few bags as samples and donate the rest in cases which is much easier for us as well as them.

Kelly, from Hamden has told me she does not expect them to be able to provide boxes for Thanksgiving again this year. We will provide boxes for those who sign up as we have in the past. Joe will talk to the college about providing us with turkeys at a reduced price,


