

Highlights of October Parish Council

The October meeting of Parish Council opened with Barb Jones sharing devotions from the book "Wintering" by Katherine May. The passage read reminded everyone of the power of rest and retreat after difficult times. She reminded us that plants and animals don't fight winter as they prepare and adapt and we should also.

During the Topic of the Month the results of the Stewardship survey were discussed. The idea of doing this survey came out of the last Finance committee meeting. Each Sunday, for the last three, a question was included in the bulletin for the congregation to answer and handed in during the collection. The three questions were "Why do you give to the United Ministry of Delhi?" What do you especially love about United Ministry?" What's the best thing we've done together in the last five years at the United Ministry of Delhi?" The response was very good and the information will be used to help craft the stewardship letter to the membership.

Eloise Henault reported that Playschool was going well. There are currently five children enrolled. They have been busy taking field trips to places in the community.

The Treasurers Report as of October 1, 2024 was reviewed and discussed. We should be at 75% for expenses and income for the year. Total income is at 59% and expense is in line at 66%.

Finance met on October 8, 2024 and reviewed the financial reports. Quarterly statements were discussed and will be sent out.

It was discussed that getting "Current Expenses" fund closer to zero by the end of the year should happen. Also discussed were ways to do so without ending up with excessive funds sitting in local banks earning minimal interest. This year's goals were to keep our money in investments earning the best returns for as long as possible.

Also discussed and recommended to Trustees was that they transfer funds within investments to the Memorial Fund. 2025 Budget will be discussed at the next meeting on November 5^{th} .

Gideon reported that Trustees initiated a transfer (exchange) within the investment funds from General Investment Funds to fill the new money market

account that was opened for the amount of \$74,500. Also \$12,000 was transferred from the Reserve Fund to the Memorial Investment Fund. This transfer was simpler to execute than withdrawing funds and then sending them back to investments.

Kiff completed servicing the furnace at the parsonage and the furnace at the church. Light bulbs on the roof of the sanctuary and the bell tower were replaced/repaired. Ventilation and fans are shut down and winterized.

Barb Jones reported that SPR will meet on September 24^{th.} A suggestion was brought to them to limit the passing of the peace due to germs and illness. Their next meeting will be on October 29thh and they will be reviewing the United Methodist annual reporting documents 1 and 2. Staff evaluations are ongoing. Fran Ackerly has resigned as sexton as of the end of the year. Her service has been exceptional and we are most grateful.

Pastor Cathy reported that Rosella Frisbee was baptized on 9/29/24. Kids Club has a steady four children and is going great. She mentioned that she wasn't sure how long we will continue, if the need is not out there due to conflicts with PTA after school activities. Raising the age of the Kids Club was discussed to allow or shift to keep some of the older kids engaged. The acolytes are doing well and are handling their schedule well.

The Delhi Clergy Association is active. It is United Ministry's turn to organize the community Thanksqiving Dinner. Liz Frisbee has agreed to take this project on.

Pastor Cathy reported that the Thanksgiving Service will be at the Delhi Community Church the Sunday prior to Thanksgiving.

Our Cooperative Parish is holding their gathering and charge conferences on November 9th in Margaretville. We will be holding our Annual meeting tentatively on January 19, 2025.

Pastor Cathy has put a funeral planning form out for anyone who is interested. She reported she will be away on November 10^{th} and 17^{th} . Chelsea Frisbee is filling the pulpit on the 11/10/24 and she is working on someone for the 17^{th} . Cathy has been leading a worship class on Saturday mornings. She has brought in Deb to help share some tips and tricks with her wealth of knowledge in assisting with our worship services and putting things together. Cathy will be having lunch with Deb Fleming

about the Presbyterian Trinity Covenant of Churches and discussing their need for a pastor with a potential 25% time allocation. Nominating Committee will get started soon on their duties for next year. Cathy will be attending the Bishops gathering of Elders on 10/30. All Saint's Sunday is November 3rd.

Evelyn (Worship) reported that worship is going well. We discussed inviting others to host coffee hour as everyone really enjoys the fellowship time together.

The Mission report is that we are in charge of organizing the Community Thanksgiving Dinner and our thanks to Liz Frisbee for taking charge of this event. There will be a Food Giveaway on 11/9/24. The need in the community remains large and the Food Pantry is being well used. Edie is making plans to distribute Thanksgiving Boxes to Food Pantry clients.

Council gave approval for the following groups to use the building: Bushel New Babes (community wide children clothing swap), Girl Scout all day event, and Boy Scouts Troop #33 meetings on Sunday evenings.

It was also reported by Barb and Carol that the Helfgott -Renfro Foundation grant application has been submitted for funds to support our church community missions.

Our next council meeting will be on November 19th.

Our meeting was closed in prayer.

Food Mission

We continue to be very busy supplying food to those who need it. Carol is planning another senior distribution for Nov.9th and Deb delivers boxes to those at the Buena Vista on the 3rd Thurs of the month. That number started out at 10 and has since increased to 17 in Oct.

We continue to see 40-50 families a month at the pantry and some of those have several under 18 living at home meaning the total number of people has increased. A girl from one of the ARC programs wanted to do volunteer work so she has come in several times with her life coach to help out. The Girl Scouts have offered to help when they have time that coincides with my need for help.

The pantry will be giving out boxes of food and turkeys for Thanksgiving dinner. Currently I believe we have 20 families signed up. The boxes get handed out the Monday before Thanksgiving and I try to get them packed either Sat. or Sun. before so have asked the scouts if they can help with that.

I am also asking the scouts if they can help me get the boxes of food sorted and moved from the hallway outside room 5/6 to the pantry and storeroom. Speaking of those boxes they are part of the food we received from the Price Chopper promotion. Some of that has gone to support Carol's distributions, some Deb Flemming took to Hamden for a food box they have, some went to the college for students who can't go home on short vacations and at least 2 cases of each we sent to North Carolina to help the hurricane victims.

Shop the Lot is planning to continue in November so weather permitting we will plan to go to Oneonta for some produce. At least once a week and sometimes more Pattie and I have been shopping in Price Chopper for perishables and sale items that we can use. We also get some items at the dollar store so lots of hauling of groceries.

I believe the school is planning a food drive.

Thank all of you for your continued help, support and donations. Have a happy Thanksqiving.


