


#### **All Saints Sunday**

## **Highlights of the September Parish Council Meeting**

The September meeting of the Parish Council began with devotions led by Fren Onasch. He shared that with the beautiful day we just had it reminded him of the verse in Psalm 118, "This is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad in it."

During the topic of the month Barb Jones and Carol Greene talked about their meeting with the SUNY Delhi architectural program director, Max Dehne. The intent was to see if the designing work for the front steps could be done by students in this program since we will need sketches and specifics to present for the Sacred Sites Grant. Jeff Ackerly attended this meeting, as a trustee that was willing to work on this project. After discussion with Max, Jeff suggested he go back to Trustees to discuss how to move forward as he feels the work may not be as involved as suspected.

Eloise Henault reported that Play School has begun and there are currently 7 children attending. There will be a board meeting by the end of the month.

The Treasurer's Report was distributed online, prior to the meeting. Laura indicated that income should be at 67% for this time of year. Income is currently at 53% and expenses were at 59%. After looking over the report it was approved by the council.

The Finance Committee reported after further discussions with DNB, it was decided not to pursue the cancelling of debit cards and applying for credit cards for the food bank as intended from the August Parish Council Meeting. Council voted that the debit cards will now have a restriction from use at ATMs and will only be used for store purchases.

Carol has mostly been the one doing the weekly counting and the intention is to train additional counters so a rotating schedule can be put into place. Stephanie will be trained as Financial Secretary.

Finance committee decided that the amount in Playschool scholarship (Memorial from Dottie Cook) is \$4655. Finance committee will meet on October 8<sup>th</sup>.

Gideon has reported that the Money Market account has been opened with \$500 and trustees will transfer the remaining amount into the account. Parking lot

has been sealed and lines painted. The trustees decided to subscribe to a service plan with Kiff for the parsonage which includes 24 hr. emergency service and an annual inspection and service. They don't offer a plan for a system the size of the church building, so they will service at time and materials on that system. Trustees have a railing or handle at the front of the sanctuary on their list of things to complete.

Barb Jones reported that SPR did not meet in August but was planning on meeting on September 24<sup>th</sup>.

Pastor Cathy thanked all for the support when she was out with the death of her mother, and then during her illness. We will not be doing the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday with the Presbyterians because we will be baptizing Rosella Frisbee on that day. She is looking for feedback about continuing this practice since many members of our congregation do not attend when it is held at other churches. She reported she will host the Presbyterian clergy group for lunch this week.

Cathy is working on becoming a United Methodist. She has been invited to teach a lay class on the sacraments in October, or maybe in the spring. Kids Club has begun and on September 22 Bibles will be given to the 2<sup>nd</sup> graders and honor acolytes. Blessing of the animals will be on Sunday, October 6<sup>th</sup>. Council approved the motion to baptize Rosella Grace Frisbee on September 29<sup>th</sup>.

The only NOW report was that there was a Food Giveaway on September 14<sup>th</sup> with 70 boxes of food distributed.

In other business the council approved the request for membership transfer of Ed Chytalo from The United Ministry to the First Presbyterian Church of Delhi.

Carol reported that she has been having discussions with the AED company that currently charges us \$305 a year. Basically Deb reports to them each month and goes over the supplies needed/used. According to them we are not in compliance because we do not have a member trained in CPR. Gideon is going to talk with a colleague at work who helped place them in his office and report back to council.

The Council approved a building request from AA (a new men's group) to use the church on Sundays from 5:30-7:30. Council approved a request for use of the


building by Delta Kappa Gamma for the use of Mac Hall on November 13 from 4:45pm to 7:30 pm.

Our meeting was closed with prayer.

The word acolyte is derived from the Greek word akolouthos, meaning companion, attendant, or helper, who waits continually upon another: a follower. The Acolyte ministry has its roots in the Old Testament of the Holy Bible, where the prophet Samuel is seen assisting Eli, the Levite priest, and Elisha is seen assisting Elijah the Prophet.

Since ancient times, light and fire have reminded people that God is here with us. The Acolyte brings in the light to the candles on the worship table, and then at the end of the service takes the light again with the candlelighter before extinguishing the candles and then walks out with the lighted candlelighter to remind the people that when we go out into the world

God will be there with us.
