### Summary of Parish Council's May 2025 Meeting

There were many topics of the month as there is lots going on at United Ministry.

We started our discussion with the transition to a half time pastor. SPR has been discussing what this would like since DSS Karen Monk said it would be Sunday plus 2-3 days. It was agreed that he should attend Parish Council every month but maybe not Trustees or Finance. The conference recommends that SPR meet with the new pastor once a month for the first 6 months to help with the transition. What are the priorities of our congregation? It was agreed that we need to be ready for flexibility.

Also discussed was the 50<sup>th</sup> Celebration and council members were given the contact survey that is being sent out to the congregation. The Steering Committee is meeting on 5/20. Once they have the contact information compiled, we will look to developing a timeline and actual dates for events. Possible slogan "Campaign for the Future"?? We discussed the goal for the campaign (\$50,000 - \$100,000) and using a steeple to chart our progress.

The Treasurer's report for April was presented by Susan Frisbee. It was noted that Faith Giving is going well, and other income and expenses appear normal. It was discussed that we probably need to adjust the budget to reflect the changes due

to having a part-time pastor, so it is easier to track. More discussion will take place at the Finance meeting in June.

Finance Committee met in April and discussed the Playschool's not having enough to meet payroll in May. That conversation continued at council because of an email from Fran that Pastor Cathy received with the information that she had advanced \$1000 to pay the last pay period of May, leaving Playschool with a \$589 balance in their account. Playschool reported that they were doing a bake sale at the Memorial Day parade and were awaiting a final May tuition payment which should cover the \$1000, which they considered a loan that would be paid back. Playschool currently has 9 verbal commitments for 2025-2026. After much discussion it was decided that Carol Greene, Pastor Cathy and Susan Frisbee would ask to meet with Pam Savage and Laura Mills to gather more information about plans for next year.

Gideon reported that Trustees met on May 13<sup>th</sup>. The fire alarm panel has been replaced. On their workday trustees finished outside clean-up work at the church and light bulbs were replaced inside of the church. They are coordinating the floor replacement in the parsonage master bedroom with Pastor Cathy's move date. The Trustees had planned to move funds from investment fund to the money market but later found that Fran needed funds, so they authorized a \$15,000 transfer to DNBD instead.

Barb Jones reported that SPR met on May  $9^{th}$  and talked about the transition. They are completing performance reviews. Cathy's last day preaching will be June  $22^{nd}$ .

Pastor Cathy reported that there will be communion on both June 1<sup>st</sup> and June 22<sup>nd</sup>. Cathy will be out of town 5/23-5/25 for a retreat and Janine Ware will preach on the 25th. Kids' Club will finish this week. Bible study is continuing. Cathy will be hosting a picnic for Women's Open Circle in June. She will be attending the Annual Conference June 5 <sup>-</sup>June 8<sup>th</sup>. Greg Garis will be preaching on Sunday June 8<sup>th</sup> which is Pentecost Sunday. Pastor Cathy attended the District Conference and met with the Cooperative Parish as well. She will meet with the local Presbyterian cluster on May 29<sup>th</sup>.

The Food Pantry continues to be busy. There will be a Food Giveaway on June  $7^{\text{th}}$ .

Witness report by Fred included that Men's breakfast will be at his house on 5/20/25.

### **Food Mission**

I know some of you have asked if between the budget cuts and tariffs and all the other stuff that keeps changing with the government if I have noticed an effect in the food pantry. I'm not sure how much has filtered down to us yet. I do know that the food bank in Hamden has seen a decrease in the amount of grant money they have. We still have about 40 families a month that are using the pantry (not always the same ones) and an increase in the number of families with kids under 18. I expect that once the school year ends and there are no longer school lunch programs available that this may increase. But as anyone who has volunteered at the food pantry can tell you the usage is as unpredictable as the weather!

Hamden doesn't always have things I need such as crackers, chunky soup and rice. The donations that come in and the items I purchase on sale usually go almost as fast as they come in! Please be sure that any food items for the pantry are left either in the red wagon or the pantry. There have been unmarked items left in Mac Hall and the kitchen and I don't know if they are for the pantry or a group that is using the church.

Carol is planning another food giveaway for June 7th. She may be a little short on help this time but wanted to get in one more before the summer. Deb continues taking boxes to the motel once a month for the people being housed there.


Printed forms are included separately and may be returned to either Chelsea or Carol or sent to the church office. We encourage the return of forms by June  $15^{\text{th}}$ .




